Who Is Responsible?

Who was responsible for Jesus' death? Jesus' predictions of His own death often lay responsibility at the feet of the Sanhedrin, the ruling body of the Jews referred to as the elders, chief priests, and scribes in the Gospel accounts (Matthew 16:21; Mark 10:33; Luke 9:22; cf. Luke 24:20). Caiaphas, as high priest over the Sanhedrin, is a figure that stands out among this ruling body, determining the plot for the death of Jesus (John 11:49-53), and formulating the charges made against Jesus in order to hand him over to be crucified (Mark 14:61-64).

Certainly Judas shares in the responsibility, the fact of his betrayal being the common epithet attached to his name in the lists of the apostles and other places (Matthew 10:4; Mark 3:19; John 12:4; 18:2, 5). Jesus Himself said to the twelve, "one of you shall betray me" (Matthew 26:21; cf. Mark 14:18; John 13:21). The devil had been working on Judas for some time. As early as John 6:70, Jesus said "one of you is a devil" in reference to him. Judas' criticism of Mary anointing Jesus' feet shows his growing greed and his sinful habit of stealing from the bag where Jesus' band of disciples pooled their money (John 12:6). Jesus knew Judas was set on gaining more money by any means, thus when the opportunity presented itself Satan was allowed an open door into his heart (John 13:27). He made the deal to deliver Jesus for 30 pieces of silver and led the Jewish authorities to Jesus (Matthew 26:15, 48; Mark 14:43-46; Luke 22:47).

The Gentiles, or nations, were also to blame (Matthew 20:19; Mark 10:33; Luke 18:32). Crucifixion was a form of Roman execution. It was a Roman centurion and his soldiers who actually drove the spikes and supervised the crucifixion of our Lord (Matthew 27:35, 54). Pilate, the Roman prefect, was at Jerusalem during the feast of Passover. His presence was needed because so many Jewish travelers streamed into the city. When Jesus was brought to Pilate, He tried to send Him to Herod, but Herod sent Him back (Luke 23:6-11). He had Jesus scourged, thinking that would pacify the accusers, but the Jews wanted the death penalty for Jesus (John 19:1-7). Pilate tried to have Jesus released by giving the people the obvious choice between Jesus and Barabbas as who was worthy to be released, but the crowd was intent on Jesus being crucified (Matthew 27:15-22). Pilate caved to the pressure of the people and sent Jesus to be crucified (Matthew 27:26; Mark 15:15; John 19:16).

We could go on and on with the involvement of various parties in the crucifixion of Jesus Christ, but the truth in summation is that all of mankind was responsible for His death. A few times in the Gospel accounts the statement is made that Jesus was delivered "into the hands of men" indicating not only the particular parties we have just mentioned, but humanity in general (Matthew 17:22; Mark 9:31; Luke 9:44). Luke 24:7 says that Jesus was delivered into the hands of sinful men. Other occasions use the phrase "into the hands of sinners" (Matthew 26:45; Mark 14:41). This is the synopsis of us all, is it not? We all have sinned and fallen short of God's glory, and thus God needed to be just in punishing sin, but displayed His love in sending His own Son to die in our place (Romans 3:23-26; 5:8). Since I am responsible for Jesus' death because of my own sin, I should live the rest of my life for Him (2 Corinthians 5:15, 21; Galatians 2:20). -Mark Day
