What the World Desperately Needs

When Jesus was nearing the accomplishment of the mission for which He came into the world, He said to His disciples, knowing He would leave them in this world, "Peace I leave with you, My peace I give to you; not as the world gives do I give to you. Let not your heart be troubled, neither let it be afraid" (Jn. 14:27). We are living in fearful times when individuals are so fragmented; many are prone to lash out at one another. The world views peace as the absence of war, but Jesus offers peace that means more than the suspension of killing one another. It means even more than non-violent coexistence with mounting tensions. The peace Jesus offers is a wholeness where the shattered pieces of our lives are placed back where they are supposed to be and we can balance our lives on Him no matter what is thrown at us.

This peace begins with our souls having peace with God. Paul wrote, "Therefore, having been justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ" (Rom. 5:1). Jesus is the means by which this peace with God is achieved. He died to remove the sins that separate us from God (1 Pet. 3:18), He rose again to defeat death and deliver us from the fear of death (Heb. 2:9, 14-15; 1 Pet. 1:3), and to those who make Him their Lord, He is an advocate before the Father to continue to plead their case and remove their sins as they walk in the light (1 Jn. 1:5-9; 2:1). In Romans 5, Paul goes on to highlight how when my soul is at peace with God, then I can even rejoice in sufferings and tribulations, knowing that they draw me deeper into the love of God (Rom. 5:3-5). I can trust that God knows what He is doing and has my best interest at heart. As the inspired prophet said to God, "You will keep him in perfect peace, whose mind is stayed on You, because he trusts in You" (Isa. 26:3).

Those who have peace with God can then have true peace with one another. Ephesians 2:16 speaks of the reconciliation that Jews and Gentiles had in the first century with one another and God in Christ's body, the church. Jesus instructed His disciples to tell every person in every nation of the world about the good news of salvation that He offers to all (Mt. 28:18-20; Mk. 16:15-16; Lk. 24:47). People from all nations, cultures, races, and backgrounds have peace in the Lord's universal kingdom, the church of Christ.

In this life, there will always be pressures that pull people apart; however, we can have peace in the presence of these pressures by turning to the Prince of Peace (Isa. 9:6). The apostle Paul commanded the Philippians, "Be anxious for nothing, but in everything by prayer and supplication, with thanksgiving, let your requests be made known to God; and the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and minds through Christ Jesus" (4:6-7). We want a fragmented world to know the wholeness that Jesus offers. Paul went on to say, "...I have learned in whatever state I am, to be content: I know how to be abased, and I know how to abound. Everywhere and in all things I have learned both to be full and to be hungry, both to abound and to suffer need. I can do all things through Christ who strengthens me" (4:11-13). As people all over the world search for happiness, we want them to know about this contentment Paul described. The world needs to know about the Bible, Jesus, His church, and salvation. Come and listen this week to our guest speaker, Roger Rush, present these vital truths we want the world to know. -Mark Day
