Master of the Sea

One of the miracles all three Synoptics record is Jesus calming the stormy sea (Mt. 8:23-27; Mk. 4:35-41; Lk. 8:22-25). The storm arose on the Sea of Galilee, with which some of the disciples of Jesus were quite familiar due to their work as fisherman on this body of water (Lk. 5:1-9). Violent storms were not uncommon here; the cold air from the surrounding mountains (e.g. Mt. Hermon at almost 10,000 ft.) would mix with the warm air near the lake's surface to produce sudden tempests. Peter, James, and John may have seen many storms before, but they were convinced this one would kill them (Mt. 8:25; Lk. 8:24). Waves beat into their ship so that it was filling with water and they were in jeopardy (Mk. 4:37; Lk. 8:23).

While Matthew and Luke both relate the disciples' request to Jesus to save them because they were perishing, Mark presents their question, "Master, do you not care that we are perishing?" (4:38). They wondered why Jesus was asleep; was the Lord not concerned that they were about to die? In reply, Jesus rebuked the wind, commanded the sea to be still, and then asked the disciples a question. His question was, "Where is your faith?" (Luke 8:25). The Synoptics relate Jesus remarking on the faith of several who were not disciples—even sinners, Samaritans, and Gentiles—while the disciples of Jesus are often rebuked for their lack of faith. There is indeed a difference between an initial understanding of the identity of Jesus by one miraculous event and taking up one's cross daily (Lk. 9:23). Nevertheless, the disciples had seen enough evidence of the power of Jesus and His love for them to have no excuse for their lack of faith. We have all of these miracles recorded for us in the Bible, but is our faith any better? The question Jesus asked the disciples in the ship with Him on this occasion is a pertinent question to ask His disciples today. Where is your faith, especially when times are hard and you find yourself in the midst of the storm of life? When money is tight, when your health fails, or when friends and family worry you, where is your faith?

My faith must remain in Him who leads me beside the still waters (Psa. 23:2). The Lord is in control. The clash of people and nations may be like the noise of the sea (Isa. 17:12); however, the Lord stills all (Psa. 65:7). God rules in the kingdom of men (Dan. 4:17; 7:2); He rules the raging of the sea (Psa. 89:9). The unfailing love of God who calms the stormy sea is extolled in the words of Psalm 107:23-31:

Those who go down to the sea in ships,
Who do business on great waters,
They see the works of the LORD,
And His wonders in the deep.
For He commands and raises the stormy wind,
Which lifts up the waves of the sea.
They mount up to the heavens,
They go down again to the depths;
Their soul melts because of trouble.
They reel to and fro, and stagger like a drunken man,
And are at their wits' end.
Then they cry out to the LORD in their trouble,
And He brings them out of their distresses.
He calms the storm,
So that its waves are still.
Then they are glad because they are quiet;
So He guides them to their desired haven.
Oh, that *men* would give thanks to the LORD *for* His goodness,
And *for* His wonderful works to the children of men!

7 Precautions While Here

1. Please, in the parking lot, make every attempt to maintain a safe social distance as you quickly enter or exit the main entry.
2. Wear a facial covering, or mask, that covers both your mouth and nose at all practical times. If you do not have a mask, one will be made available to you as you enter the main foyer.
3. On Sunday, please pick up communion supplies in the foyer before service for you and your family. A collection box is located in the main foyer for your contributions.
4. Please move through the foyer quickly to avoid crowding in the foyer. Please, remember to social distance (six feet) and no handshaking or hugging ... for now. Plus, the drinking fountain is off limits for now.
5. The auditorium has every other row of pews closed off to allow appropriate spacing of households. Remember to maintain six feet spacing in the pew between households.
6. Restroom access will be allowed for only one person at a time; parent and child exceptions are allowed. Upon exiting the restroom, you are asked to please disinfect the areas of the restroom you have utilized. Sanitizing sprays are available in the restrooms. Any child under age 12 should be accompanied by an adult to ensure proper disinfecting.
7. Hand sanitizers are available in the foyer, as well as tissues and proper waste disposal containers.
