Now that we have our own space we have been able to host Bible studies and English classes, as well as open our home to our friends. Since we moved in the kids seem to be getting more settled into their new home. Caleb and Charlie are learning new Spanish words every day and enjoy practicing with our friends. We have also met several of our new neighbors and look forward to the relationships that may be formed with them. We are all finally getting settled into a good routine here.

A WEEK IN THE LIFE

We thought it might be nice to give you all a glimpse into what our week typically looks like. On Sundays we have our main Bible study with a crowd of both Peruvians and Venezuelans. These are contacts we had from previous trips to Peru. We usually meet around 2:30 and end a few hours later with a meal together. On Mondays Audrey has Spanish tutoring. Tuesdays we try to run errands around downtown. On Wednesdays Audrey has Spanish tutoring again and Daniel meets with one of our Venezuelan friends, Bryan, for English and Bible study. Thursdays we head to the "El Tambo" market where we buy most of our groceries for the week. In the afternoon we have Bible study with one of our Peruvian friends, Edi. Fridays we reserve for outings with new friends. We have been invited to soccer games, birthday parties, and women's studies.





We have a few people we meet with for Bible studies throughout the week, but those times vary depending on their schedules. We are enjoying this little groove we have created, but are looking forward to all of the things our schedules will be filled with in the future.

VISA UPDATE

Peru granted us a 90 day tourist visa when we entered the country, which means our visas expired at the end of August. Thankfully the lawyer who we are working with to obtain our residency visa has all of our documents and we finally have an Interpol appointment at the end of September. We will have to travel to Lima (the capitol of Peru) for this appointment. After our Interpol appointment, we will have several more trips to Lima over the coming months for appointments at the immigrations office. Please pray that all of our documents are accepted by the Peruvian government and that these appointments go smoothly.
