BUSY SCHEDULES

Our month began with a trip to Lima! Thankfully our trip went smoothly, and we returned to Huancayo with our visas in hand. Once we returned, our schedules began filling up quickly! We have added several Bible studies throughout the week. Daniel has been hosting a men's Bible study on Wednesday evening. Audrey has also been hosting a women's study on Friday evening as well as a ladies' cooking class/Bible study on Saturday mornings. The ladies who come over on Saturday swap Peruvian recipes for American dessert recipes- it's a fun time for all! As we mentioned before, one of our strategies for starting Bible studies with individuals is to simply get out into the community and live! This strategy has recently paid off-the lady who we buy our fruit from at the market every week invited us to her house to have a Bible study as well as teach English to some of the kids in her

neighborhood. On our first visit she had over 10 people there waiting for the Bible study to begin! It was encouraging to see her enthusiasm as she called people off the street to come and join us. In addition to these new studies, we continue meeting with Faustina every Friday afternoon, as well as a few other individual studies that are less consistent every week. We are encouraged by these opportunities for new studies and are hopeful they produce good fruits! Please be in prayer with us for the souls who are attending.

TIME FOR SCHOOL

We took a big step this month and signed the kids up for preschool! The kids will be attending three days a week for a few hours each day. This will be a big change for all of us as it will be the first time the kids will be regularly away from us, and our plans were always to homeschool them in the US. However, this will provide them with the opportunity to learn Spanish and make new friends, and we will get to meet new families as well. They seem to be excited about attending schoolwe pray it remains that way! Please be in prayer for all of us during this change!



CURRENT NEEDS

We have had a few people in our study groups who have expressed a need for help with schooling costs for their children. Schools operate a little differently here compared to public schools in the States. You pay a one-time enrollment fee and then a monthly fee for each child. There are also one-time costs such as school supplies and uniform expenses. All of these can add up to a hefty sum for most families here. These prices vary child-to-child and school-to-school.
