


IN SICKNESS AND HEALTH

Our second month in Huancayo has been a doozy. We have all taken turns being sick. We are not entirely sure what we have been passing around, but it has made the month a mostly uneventful one. Thankfully we all seem to be on the mend now. Please pray that remains the case. During this time of sickness we did come to realize just how quickly we are becoming recognizable members of this community. One week while the kids were sick Daniel went to the market alone. Everyone immediately asked where the kids were. It is an important first step to establish a presence in a community and it's encouraging to see this taking place so quickly.

HOUSING UPDATE

We do have at least one exciting update this month- we finally have the keys to our new house! We picked them up on Thursday and have since been running around picking up appliances and working on the house. The house needs a little TLC before we are able to move in, but we are still hoping to be sleeping in our new home by the end of the first week of August. It's located very close to one of the main universities in Huancayo so we hope to establish relationships with some of the college students and staff. This could be a great opportunity to share the Gospel with this demographic within the city. Our house is also large enough to host Bible studies and other gatherings. We are thankful to have a usable ministry space within our home.



MINISTRY UPDATE

Despite our illnesses, we have continued to have regular Bible studies with several families. There seems to be a deep desire to study God's word and to follow His instruction. There are individuals who have grown up with varying religious backgrounds who have never read the Bible for themselves. For perspective, many in our group do not know where to find the books of the Bible or even how to look up a chapter and verse. Every study involves several questions from the group and we are encouraged by their genuine interest in studying. We were also able to help a single mother, Fran, who we have known since last summer. She has been unable to enroll her three young daughters in school since fleeing to Peru from Venezuela and we had a family donate the funds she needed to send them all to school. Fran is overjoyed at the opportunity for her girls to get an education. Please be in prayer for Fran and her three sweet girls as they continue to try and survive in Peru. Fran is one of the individuals in our regular study so please also pray that her heart remain open to the Gospel.
