WE HAVE ARRIVED!

On June 3rd we boarded a plane and began our journey to Huancayo! We arrived in Lima late that evening and then the next day we took one last flight up the mountain. Our travels were uneventful and we made it with all of our luggage. Thank you for your prayers for safety as we traveled. It meant so much to us knowing you were lifting us up during this time.

Since we arrived in Huancayo, our days have been spent running around collecting household goods, reconnecting with people we know, and adjusting to our new life here. While we have remained in good health (minus the occasional bout of digestive issues) we did have to make an emergency run to the clinic during our first week because Charlie was having an issue adjusting to the altitude. Thankfully, after a few breathing treatments, she is back to her normal self and hasn't had any issues since.

EXCITING NEWS

One of our first priorities after arriving was finding a house to rent. Unfortunately there aren't many houses for rent right now. Most people were only interested in selling. While we looked at several properties, we weren't having much luck. The properties were either shared houses (houses are often rented by floor here), located on a very busy street in the city, or they were much too fancy for locals to feel comfortable visiting our home. We are so glad to say we have finally found a house that will work for us! We met with the lady who owns the property on the 27th to sign the rental agreement. She is currently living there with her family and needs time to move, so we will not be moving in until August 1st. We are thankful for Daniel's family and their willingness to allow us to stay with them until the house is ready! For those who have asked, we will share our address with you all once we move in.

CONNECTING & RECONNECTING

As we mentioned above, since we arrived we have been reconnecting with several people we know in Huancayo. Several of those people are part of a large group of Venezuelans we had met during our visit last year. We were excited to discover they were still very interested in studying the Bible, so we resumed meeting with them on Sunday mornings. Our first few Bible studies have been very exciting and there seems to be a lot of engagement and questions regarding what the Bible teaches. People have been eager to study and learn God's word. We pray this interest continues and develops into a passion for serving Jesus.

In addition to this group we have met several other people who have asked for Bible studies or English classes. The realtor who helped us find our house has asked us to have a Bible study with her and her husband. While plant shopping, we met a young man who was interested in English classes. Our future land lady asked about English classes for her two children. We have a program ready to go that uses the Bible to teach English and Audrey is excited to implement this program soon!
