HAPPY THANKSGIVING!

Things were a bit different this year as we were away from both of our families for Thanksgiving. Nevertheless, we were privileged to share a traditional Thanksgiving meal with a young couple here in Huancayo. We were even able to find a frozen turkey! It was great to spend time with friends on a day that was made difficult by the absence of family. The following Sunday we prepared another traditional meal to share with the folks after our Bible study. They seemed to enjoy the meal and appreciated being included in something traditional to the US.

MINISTRY UPDATES:

Things are progressing well here in Huancayo! We continue to meet with several people throughout the week in addition to our usual Sunday crowd. We have made new contacts as well as deepened the relationships with people we already know. You never know where a new contact might come from. For example, our fruit lady has expressed interest in joining us for our weekly Bible studies. We are hoping to see a few new faces at our next study! As we have continued some of our established studies, many folks are arriving at cross-roads where they must decide if they will choose to place their faith in Christ and obey His word, or if they will instead continue in their current state. This is a critical time for many folks, and we pray they will be moved by the Gospel and choose to obey it.

For example, Bryan, one of the Venezuelans we have been studying with since arriving, said he wanted to be baptized. He and Daniella (his girlfriend) came to our house several weeks ago and the first thing he asked was how he could be baptized. We spoke for a while and discussed a number of things, including repentance. A couple of weeks later he again said he wanted to be baptized, but he said now that he knows it is fornication to be living with his girlfriend. He feels like he would be insulting God to be baptized and then return immediately to living with her. It is exciting that he realizes this aspect of what it means to repent and follow Christ, but his living situation is a great hindrance to his ability to become a Christian and follow Christ. A person certainly does not need to be perfect to become a Christian, but there does need to be a Biblical understanding of what is involved with conversion, and repentance is an essential aspect of that. We pray he will make the decision to repent and be baptized soon, but ultimately the decision is his to make.

Another example of people at a crossroad is Ara and her adult daughters. Andrea and Fran. Fran has been a part of our study group since we arrived in Peru, and her mother and sister arrived to Huancayo about two months ago and have also been participating in our studies and worship services since arriving. They, like all Venezuelans here in Peru, have faced enormous struggles over the past several years. They have a Catholic background, but now they have said they can see Catholicism is incompatible with New Testament Christianity. They face the decision of leaving the faith they have known their entire lives. They have expressed a hesitancy to becoming a Christian when there are so many things they do not yet know, and this is understandable. It is no small decision, but we pray they will continue to have the desire to study the Bible for themselves and choose to become children of God by obeying the Gospel.

WHAT'S NEXT:

December is shaping up to be our busiest month yet! We are heading to Lima for our next visa appointment on the 14th of December. We ask that you please pray that this appointment goes smoothly. Lord willing, this will be our final appointment before we receive our official residency cards. We are planning a Christmas movie night for the kids at our house in the coming weeks. Caleb and Charlie are looking forward to celebrating Christmas with their friends! We will also have other Christmas related festivities with friends and Daniel's family. While we are sad to be so far away from family and friends this time of year, we are looking forward to the new traditions we will create here in Huancayo. We can't wait to share all of our experiences with you next month!
