

King David: A Type of Christ

The New Testament opens with a genealogy of Jesus Christ which highlights His descent from David (Mt. 1:1). Hebrews 1:5 connects the promise God made to David in 2 Samuel 7:12-14 beyond his immediate heir, Solomon, to his more-distant descendant, Jesus Christ, the Son of God. The golden age of Israel's united monarchy brought about through David pointed toward Jesus the Messiah, King of kings (1 Tim. 6:15; Rev. 17:14; 19:16), who came to establish His church, a kingdom which will never be destroyed (Dan. 2:44; Mt. 16:18). Yet, there are more aspects of David's life relating to his kingship that prefigure Christ.

David is first introduced in the historical narrative of 1 Samuel as the youngest son of Jesse who was out keeping the sheep when Samuel had visited to anoint the next king (1 Sam. 16:11-13). When Goliath challenged the men of Israel encamped at the valley of Elah, David went back and forth to feed his father's sheep at Bethlehem (1 Sam. 17:15). Though his eldest brother used the occupation of shepherding to disparage him (1 Sam. 17:28), David's experience in defending the flock from a lion and a bear gave him confidence that God would deliver the victory over Goliath (1 Sam. 17:34-37). Later, all the tribes of Israel acknowledged that David led Israel out and brought them in as a shepherd guides his flock to pasture; while Saul was still king, David functioned as a shepherd of God's people in the role that the king should have filled (2 Sam. 5:2). When considering God's protection and deliverance for him, David by inspiration wrote the famous lines of Psalm 23, acknowledging that, "The Lord is my shepherd." Jesus is the good shepherd (Jn. 10). While David went out to meet Goliath at the risk of his own life, Jesus defeated the devil and the power of death at the cost of His own life (Heb. 2:14). The good shepherd gives His life for the sheep (Jn. 10:11).

David was a mighty warrior; his victory over Goliath was the beginning of a successful military career. The Israelites clamored for a king who would fight their battles (1 Sam. 8:20). Though Saul—head and shoulders taller than other men (1 Sam. 9:2)—was chosen as the first king, he did not go out to meet the giant Goliath. Saul offered his armor to David to wear (1 Sam. 17:38). Perhaps unbeknownst to Saul, the transfer of armor signaled succession just as later Elisha assumed the mantel from Elijah (1 Kgs. 19:19). Later Saul's son Jonathan gave his clothing and weapons to David evidently with this significance (1 Sam. 18:4). While Goliath was the champion of the Philistines, representing the entire army (1 Sam. 17:4, 23), David became the champion of the Israelites. Because David won, the entire Israelite army won. This prefigures what Christ did for us. Hebrews 2:10 calls Jesus the captain of our salvation. He is the champion who went out before us to fight the battle. He is our legal representative (1 Jn. 2:1). Through Jesus Christ we are given the victory over sin and death (1 Cor. 15:57).

Unlike David, Jesus was sinless (Heb. 4:15). David was selected by God because he was a man after God's own heart (1 Sam. 13:14; Acts 13:22). Jesus always did what pleased the Father (Jn. 8:29). You and I need Jesus to be the king of our lives, to be our great shepherd who leads and defends us, and to be our champion to give us the victory over the seemingly insurmountable enemy of our souls.
