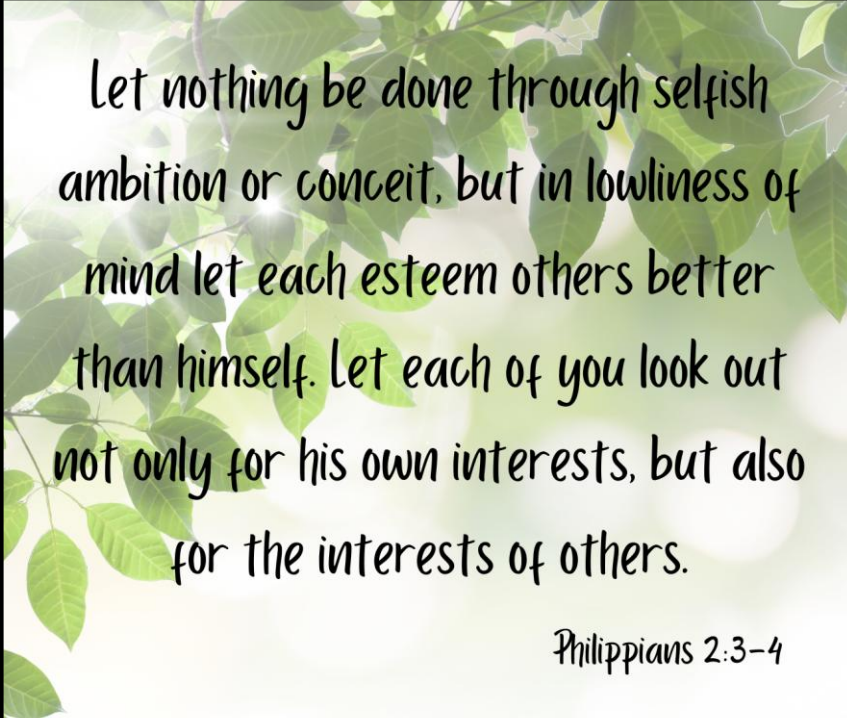

Paths

As I write my last Herald article for the Flatwoods congregation, I am both reflecting on our past together and considering our future apart. I am thankful we have shared paths in life for over fifteen years together. I have many strong memories of joy and sadness as we have experienced the highs and lows of life together (Romans 12:15). My closest friends are part of the Flatwoods congregation; friends who are there for you at all times—good and bad—are rare and precious gifts from God (Proverbs 17:17). As we approach the future, let us entrust ourselves to God and His word to save us and sanctify us to be people who glorify Him (Acts 20:32; James 1:21). Each individual plans a path in life, but how dearly we need the Lord to direct our paths (Proverbs 16:9). “Trust in the LORD with all thine heart; and lean not unto thine own understanding. In all thy ways acknowledge him, and he shall direct thy paths” (Proverbs 3:5, 6). Whatever path we follow, let us make sure we seek the old paths the Lord has designated to lead to eternal life instead of our own ways (Jeremiah 6:16; 10:23; Proverbs 14:12; 16:25). Follow God’s word, not your own wisdom (Jeremiah 10:23) nor popular opinion (Matthew 7:13, 14).

Beyond right and wrong, I need wisdom to know what is fitting at a particular juncture in life (Ecclesiastes 3:1). We ask God for wisdom, and He gives generously (James 1:5). I believe that the hand of God goes with those who seek Him (Ezra 8:22). The king granted Ezra’s request to go to Jerusalem to seek, do, and teach God’s law because the hand of the Lord his God was upon him (Ezra 7:6, 9, 10). This gave Ezra courage (Ezra 7:28). The necessary people to help were provided (Ezra 8:18). Deliverance from the enemy was supplied as they journeyed (Ezra 8:31). All of this was due to the hand of God. We can accomplish the charge God has given us because we trust in His love and providential care to see us through the unexpected changes and challenges that present themselves on our path to glory (2 Corinthians 4:15-17). All we are and all we have belong to God (1 Corinthians 4:7; 8:6; 2 Corinthians 5:18). I want to seek God and trust Him to provide a right way for me and my family as Ezra did (Ezra 8:21). Our God will deliver us (Luke 11:4; Galatians 1:4).

Remember the most important facets of the faith. We all need the grace found in Jesus Christ; being baptized into Him and continuing to walk in Him is our hope of salvation. The love of God shown in giving Jesus should transform my heart and translate into my life as I interact with others. We love each other because God first loved us. Love isn’t easy; it is sometimes difficult and different than just being nice. Genuine love that serves, corrects, and works for the best for others is vital. The teaching of the Holy Spirit contained for us in the Scriptures is what unites us. Let us always go to the Bible for all we do and teach.
