Wonderful, Marvelous Savior

When we think about Jesus Christ, our hearts are filled with gratitude and awe. The prophet Isaiah spoke of His coming centuries before His birth, declaring, *“For unto us a Child is born, unto us a Son is given; and the government will be upon His shoulder. And His name will be called Wonderful, Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace”* (Isaiah 9:6). Every title in this passage describes the greatness of our Lord, yet the word “Wonderful” captures the amazement and reverence that every believer feels when reflecting upon Him. He is truly our wonderful, marvelous Savior.

Christ is wonderful in His love. The apostle Paul reminded us, *“But God demonstrates His own love toward us, in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us”* (Romans 5:8). His love was not conditional or limited, it was extended to all humanity, even while we were unworthy. Jesus Himself said, *“Greater love has no one than this, than to lay down one’s life for his friends”* (John 15:13). At the cross, He displayed the depth of that love, offering His blood as the perfect sacrifice for our sins.

Christ is marvelous in His power to save. He declared His mission plainly: *“For the Son of Man has come to seek and to save that which was lost”* (Luke 19:10). No one else could accomplish this task. Peter boldly proclaimed, *“Nor is there salvation in any other, for there is no other name under heaven given among men by which we must be saved”* (Acts 4:12). The gospel is God’s marvelous plan to rescue us from sin and give us hope of eternal life. As Paul wrote, *“For I am not ashamed of the gospel of Christ, for it is the power of God to salvation for everyone who believes”* (Romans 1:16).

Christ is wonderful in His example. He lived a life of purity and obedience, leaving us a model to follow. Peter wrote, *“Christ also suffered for us, leaving us an example, that you should follow His steps: ‘Who committed no sin, nor was deceit found in His mouth’”* (1 Peter 2:21-22). His humility in serving others, His compassion for the hurting, and His devotion to His Father teach us how to live faithfully today.

Christ is marvelous in His victory. The resurrection is the cornerstone of our faith, and because of it, death has been defeated. Paul triumphantly declared, *“But thanks be to God, who gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ”* (1 Corinthians 15:57). That marvelous victory is shared with all who obey Him. Jesus promised, *“I am the resurrection and the life. He who believes in Me, though he may die, he shall live”* (John 11:25).

As Christians, we must never lose sight of the greatness of our Savior. The psalmist wrote, *“This was the Lord’s doing; it is marvelous in our eyes”* (Psalm 118:23). Our salvation is not the result of human effort, but the wondrous plan of God carried out through Christ. Let us respond with obedience, faithfulness, and worship. The Lord has done marvelous things, and His name is worthy to be praised.

May we daily live with joy, hope, and devotion, remembering that we serve a **Wonderful, Marvelous Savior**.
